"La rue de l'Odéon", which was opened in 1779, was the first street in Paris to have pavements and gutters, but it's also famous for other reasons.

At the turn of the century, it was a place of great literary activity. French writers such as Paul Valéry, André Gide and Paul Claudel would meet at "la Maison des Amis du Livre" located at n° 7, while at n° 12 the anglo-saxons - James Joyce, T.S. Elliot, Scott Fitzgerald, Ernest Hemingway and Gertrude Stein - would get together in the bookshop "Shakespeare and Company".

At n° 3 stands the Odéon Hotel, registered as a historical landmark for its facade and roof like most buildings in this street in the heart of Paris.

Historical associations are legion. Molière started his career in rue Mazarine. In the rue Visconti Racine died, Delacroix painted and Balzac's printing business went bust. In parallel rue des Beaux-Arts, Oscar Wilde died, Corot and Ampère, father of amps, lived, and crazy poet Gérard de Nerval walked a lobster on a lead.

There are not many Australian poems on the Great War. Oscar Walters was one the few Aussie poets and *Pozières and Passchendaele* is one of his better poems.

Pozières lies in Northern France, near the Somme. Passchendaele lies in Belgium, near Ypres.

The ANZAC's fought - and lost many men - on both fronts.

In the taking and holding of the small village of Pozières in July and August 1916 over 22,000 Australian soldiers were lost.

I am asking some of them to come up with ideas regarding your request.

We have already designed some tours on this matter, for your information, one was about Vistor Hugo and his works related to Paris (Notre-Dame (Quasimodo),

Les Misérables and the 1830 revolution, the Victor Hugo house and museum in Paris)

Another one had to do with Zola and "le ventre de Paris" (Market place "les Halles") + "Le bonheur des Dames"

(story about the first department store, how people lived and worked these days...)

The walks that I would suggest are Shakespeare's London ending at the Globe, Shakespeare and Dickens the Old City, Dickens' London, Oscar Wilde, Sherlock Holmes and Literary Bloomsbury which can be done as a pub walk if required.

The minimum charge for a private walk is 90 pounds for up to 20 and then 4pounds 50p per head over 20.

If you wanted a bus tour the charge for half a day would be 120 pounds or 177 pounds for a full day.

My tour cost estimates are based on extensive communication with overseas agents and service providers. I trust that the detail and comprehensive nature of this cost document meets with your approval.

I am able to forward a tour cost estimate based on the recent tour proposal. In the area of accommodation, hotels contacted, are unable to verify costs until October 2004 and in some cases January 2005. No availability can be confirmed at this early stage.

I have several options at some destinations and have used average quad or triple share cost/configurations. In Ireland, most accommodation is twin/double share. Costs are current for June/July 2004 and increases can be generally expected, allowing for a further period of 15 months from departure. Estimated costs are for the fullest form of the literary tour itinerary

My best quote for the Ireland sector was based on 7 days including Irish transport (Min 40 persons- 556.00 Euros pp Transport & 459.00 Euros.pp for Ground tour costs). This a lot of money, but fortunately our English transport for Amiens to UK to Ireland will come in at about half that cost.

I have averaged the Irish quote for five days. I have not finished by any means negotiating on any component of the tour.

I have estimated a little higher with accommodation, taking into account likely 2005 cost increases. I will be possible to reduce total tour costs by applying a specific transport schedules e.g. 9.00a.m.-5.00.p.m; 9.00a.m -9.00.p.m. Rationalising and omitting non-essential admissions/attractions and tours.

Or structuring the tour to your budget, giving consideration to fewer days and a change of itinerary.

Some tours/components will need to be discussed as to whether they can logistically be included on particular travel days. What about shopping and free time?

Taking out the St Paul's Teacher subsidy, a number of attractions and admissions and looking at the prospect of filling a 50+ coach would bring the per person cost below \$6000.00 on current and some projected costs.
